My maternal grandmother was born in Germany in 1934. She was Jewish and fled Germany in 1938, immigrating to Australia, after being stripped of German citizenship by the Nazi regime. Pursuant to Article 116 paragraph 2 of the German Basic Law (Constitution), former German citizens who were stripped of German citizenship on racial or political grounds and their descendants are entitled to apply to have German citizenship restored. Neither my grandmother, my mother or myself have applied to obtain German citizenship.





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#### Answer to Question 10b

I submitted a formal Declaration of Renunciation of British Citizenship to the UK Home Office. The renunciation was registered by the UK Home Office on 20 June 2018. I ceased to be a British citizen on that date (attached).

I could not have acquired Israeli citizenship from my father. A child born abroad will not acquire Israeli citizenship by descent if they were born to an Israeli parent who themselves acquired Israeli citizenship by descent. The Minister of the Interior of the State of Israel has confirmed by letter that I am not a citizen of Israel (attached).
