Dear Mr. Fitzgibbons,

You recently consulted me regarding the declaration of citizenship that the Hon. Liew O'Brien MP, Federal Member for Wide Bay, is going to submit to the Australian Parliament.

On the basis of the details transmitted by Mr. O'Brien, I can confirm to you the following:

Mr. O'Brien's grand-mother, Mrs. Rose Angel Yvonne Dalstein, born in 1903 in New Caledonia, was presumably a French citizen. When she married Mr O'Brien's grand-father in 1926, she lost her French nationality (assuming she was a French citizen). Under the French legislation which was in force at that time (the 1889 Nationality law), a French woman lost her nationality when she married a foreigner.

We have no information to support the possibility that Mr. O'Brien's grand-mother would have subsequently requested to regain her French nationality after a new legislation was introduced.

Therefore, since she was no longer a French citizen in view of her marriage in 1926, she could not have transmitted her former nationality to her daughter.

Please let me know if you should need me to do some further research.

Dear Mr. O'Brien,

This letter refers to your application for a Citizenship Certificate received on July 18, 2018. I regret to inform you that we are unable to issue you a citizenship certificate as you do not meet the legislative requirements of the Citizenship Act (CA).

The reasons why you are not eligible for a citizenship certificate are based on Section 3 of the Citizenship Act, which sets out who is a Canadian citizen. The pertinent paragraph for your application is 3(1)(g) which describes how certain persons born outside Canada before February 15, 1977, are Canadian citizens and the pertinent sub-section (as amended by Bill C-37 effective April 17, 2009) is 3(3) which limits citizenship by descent to the first generation born or adopted outside Canada. Sub-section 3(3) is specific to persons born outside Canada, whose Canadian parent was also born or adopted outside Canada.

According to information provided, your father, *Dennis Leo O'Brien*, was born outside Canada February 20, 1933. He had established a claim to Canadian citizenship under paragraph 4(1)(b) of the Canadian citizenship Act, through derivation of his father (your grand-father), *Dennis Jack O'Brien*, who was a British Subject born in Canada.

Your father lost his citizenship on February 21, 1957, pursuant to sub-section 4(2)-CCA. Legislation that came into effect on April 17, 2009, automatically restored citizenship to certain former citizens who were born in Canada or outside Canada in the first generation; and as a result, citizenship was automatically restored to your father on April 17, 2009.

Your mother, Yvonne June O'Brien (nee: Phillips) was born outside Canada, in Australia, June 01, 1935. She does not have a claim to Canadian citizenship.

Because you were born outside Canada on *June 26, 1972*, and your father was also born outside Canada, the first generation limitation found under subsection 3(3)(b)-CA is applicable to you. As a result, you do not meet the statutory requirements for citizenship outlined in Section 3 of the current Citizenship Act.

There is an exception to the first generation limitation found under subsection 3(5) of the Citizenship Act. Please note that this has been explored in order to determine if you had a parent or grandparent who was a Crown Servant at the time of your birth or at the time of your parent's birth outside Canada. However, it's been determined that you did not have a Crown Servant parent or grandparent. As such, sub-section 3(5)-CA is not applicable.

Consequently, your application has been refused, and we are unable to issue you a citizenship certificate at this time.

I understand this conclusion to your application may be disappointing. However, if you would still like to become a Canadian citizen, your first step would be to apply for permanent residence. Once you have become a permanent resident, lived in Canada for a certain period of time and fulfilled all other requirements associated with subsection [5(1)-CA], you will be able to apply for a grant of Canadian citizenship.
