Introduction

1 This paper sets out the Presiding Officers' policy on smoking in the Parliamentary precincts.

Prohibitions on smoking


- 2 Parliament House is a smoke-free building. Smoking is not permitted anywhere within the building.
- 3 Smoking is also prohibited:
 - (a) in courtyards with air intakes;
 - (b) within five metres of major entrances to the building, including the walkway adjacent to the Prime Minister's courtyard;
 - (c) the seven first floor balconies accessed from the tea rooms located at the ends of the corridors;
 - (d) within five metres of any door leading to a courtyard or other external area;
 - (e) the four underground car parks provided for building occupants and visitors; and
 - (f) designated outdoor eating and drinking areas.
- 4 The areas where smoking is prohibited are shown on the building plan at **Attachment A**. Signs have been installed to indicate that smoking is prohibited in these areas.
- 5 All building occupants and visitors to the building must comply with this policy.
