

Parliamentary Leadership Taskforce

Terms of Reference for Parliamentary Leadership Taskforce - Staff Consultation Group

- 1. The purpose of the staff consultation group is to
 - provide a forum for open and transparent communication with staff from Commonwealth parliamentary workplaces on the implementation of the Set the Standard reforms,
 - provide a mechanism for staff to express their opinions and concerns on matters that
 affect their workplace as they relate to the implementation of the Set the Standard
 reforms,
 - provide a mechanism for those responsible for implementing the *Set the Standard* reforms to listen and respond to these concerns.

2. Membership comprises:

- MoP(S) Act representatives, including
 - o five members nominated by the Government;
 - o four members nominated by the Opposition;
 - o one member nominated by the Australian Greens;
 - o one member nominated by independent parliamentarians;
 - o the permanent MoP(S) Act staff members of the MOPS Employee Consultative Group; and
 - o the permanent MoP(S) Act staff members of the MOPS Work Health and Safety Committee.
- Parliamentary Service representatives, including
 - o three members nominated by the Department of Parliamentary Services;
 - o one member nominated by the Department of the Senate; and
 - o one member nominated by the Department of the House of Representatives.
- Two members nominated by the Parliamentary Press Gallery;
- Management representatives will be invited to attend when presenting any material relevant to their workplace.
- 3. The Parliamentary Leadership Taskforce Secretariat will provide secretariat support and chair any meetings.
- 4. This body will be consultative on the implementation of the *Set the Standard* reforms and have no decision-making or veto powers.

- 5. The body may be consulted in writing or through a formal meeting.
- 6. The body will have no requirement for quorum.
- 7. The terms of consultation will be communicated alongside each item for consultation.
- 8. Members may request additional information or seek further time for the consideration of consultation.
- 9. The staff consultation group does not supersede other existing workplace-specific staff consultation bodies.
- 10. The Chair will provide regular reports to the Parliamentary Leadership Taskforce and those responsible for implementation of the *Set the Standard* reforms on matters discussed within the staff consultation group, including any recommendations or advice given.
- 11. Any changes to these terms of reference will be made in consultation with the group, with the final approval of the Parliamentary Leadership Taskforce.
- 12. The staff consultation group will be established for the duration of the Parliamentary Leadership Taskforce, or until superseded by other broad-based staff consultation arrangements or otherwise no longer required.
