## Examination of the 2014-15 Annual Report of the Integrity Commissioner

I write to thank the Committee for its recent report, tabled on 2 March 2016, relating to the Committee's consideration of ACLEI's annual report. ACLEI welcomes and values the scrutiny of the Parliament, through the Examination process, which continues to inform its approach to business improvement and strategy development.
