Senator DAVEY: I think that would be a very helpful visual tool to understand the basin and the areas that we're talking about.

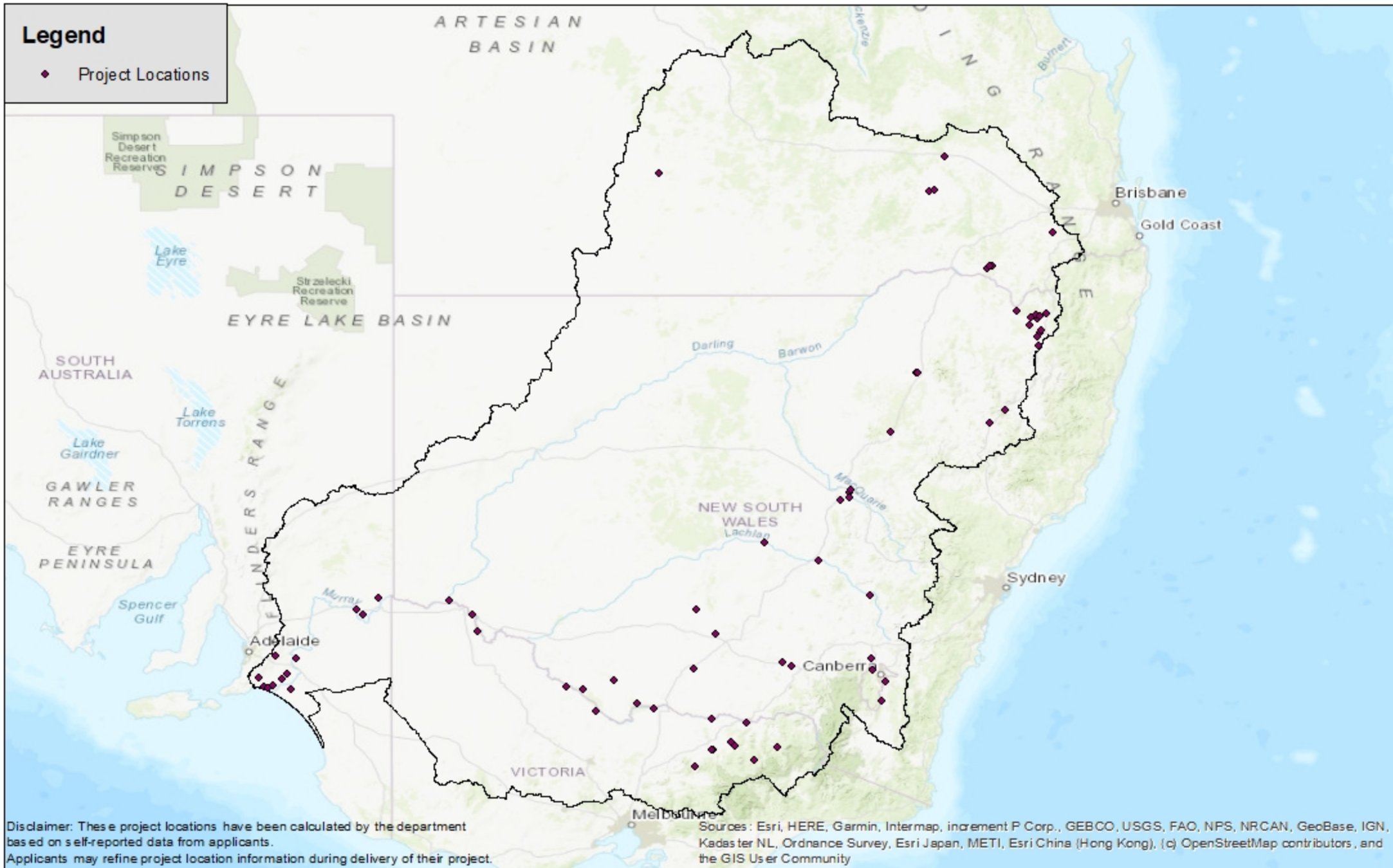
Answer:
