You warned organisations of a critical vulnerability. It says: In the absence of an official patch to the vulnerability ... That is not quite what I understood the evidence to be this morning. I understood that the vendor—that is, whoever produces Citrix—had provided a patch. Is that not right?</p> <p>Ms Noble: At the time we issued the warning or advisory, which was on 25 December 2019, Citrix, the company, didn't have a patch for the vulnerabilities. On 25 December, we were able to provide advice about a workaround for what organisations could do to protect themselves from that vulnerability.</p> <p>....</p> <p>Senator WONG: When you say vulnerable to a malicious actor, is there evidence that the data had been compromised?</p> <p>Ms Noble: No. What we understand at that point is, like many other companies and perhaps government departments, given the global nature of the Citrix vulnerability, we would generally advise people if we see a specific issue that we think might affect them. At that point, we have no further information to understand whether anybody's network has been a victim of that vulnerability or compromised in any way, only that we are seeing an attempt—perhaps someone accessing their network, if you like.</p> <p>Senator WONG: Were there any other networks in the Commonwealth about which</p>

GCHQ has the power to do this. Does the NSA?</p> <p>Ms Noble: GCHQ's powers are different from ours. They can actually prevent cyber crime and engage in those sort of activities both onshore, in the UK, and offshore, which is very different to the powers we have. I'm less sure about NSA. Unless Mr Hanmore can help me, I would have to take that on notice.</p> <p>Senator KITCHING: Do any of the five allies have that power?</p> <p>Ms Noble: I'm not sure. I would have to take that on notice.</p>
