Australia's sanctions

Since 25 February 2022, Australia has:

- . Imposed 14 tranches of targeted financial sanctions and travel bans against 488 Russian and Belarusian individuals and 33 entities (521 in total);
- . Amended our sanctions regulations twice to (1) expand our sanctions designation criteria to capture persons or entities of economic or strategic significance to Russia, and (2) extend existing sanctions measures that currently apply to Crimea and Sevastopol to the Donetsk and Luhansk regions of Ukraine; and
- Designated lists of goods as 'import sanctioned goods' and 'export sanctioned goods' for Russia, including (1) prohibiting the import of oil, refined petroleum products, natural gas, coal and other energy product from Russia, and (2) prohibiting the export of aluminium ores (including bauxite), alumina and related products to Russia.
