Prosecutions in progress

1 criminal

Prosecution outcomes

CRIMINAL: 2015-16 minor regulatory prosecutions

11 corporations were prosecuted:

- 8 for failing to lodge a general report (s. 330-10)
- 9 for failing to lodge a financial report (s. 348-1)

Results from prosecutions:

- 6 corporations were ordered to pay penalty fines totalling \$10,400.

CRIMINAL: Registrar v Lyons appeal, Downing Centre Local Court in Sydney, NSW

Former CEO of Riverina Medical and Dental Aboriginal Corporation (RivMed), Ms Selena Lyons, lodged an all grounds appeal on charges and severity of sentencing.

Result of appeal:

- 23 of the 24 charges upheld
- 18 month intensive corrections order
- reparation order of \$22,339.10.
