Due to the protest activity near Parliament House, the Australian Federal Police has closed access roads to the building.

Building occupants wanting to enter the car parks or drop-off points may need to show identification (APH passes) to police who are at the barricades.

Please exercise care and allow extra time to complete your journey.

### Turnstiles activated for pass holders only

The turnstiles off Parliament Drive at the House of Representatives and Senate entrances remain activated for Parliament House swipe card access only.

## Update on traffic arrangements at Parliament House

Due to protest activity, changed traffic arrangements are in place around Parliament House, and are being managed by ACT Policing.

Melbourne Avenue is the primary access road to Parliament House. ACT policing advise that the Commonwealth Avenue ramp will be open from 08:00am to 17:30pm for the remainder of this week.

Building occupants will not be able to access Parliament Drive from Kings Avenue or Federation Mall.

Building occupants wanting to enter the car parks or drop-off points will need to show identification (APH passes) to ACT Policing who are at the barricades.

Non-passholders with essential business in APH will be required to pre-arrange access to the building and provide credential to ACT Policing on arrival.
