Schedule on 1 April 2019. The department is working with Basin states on key implementation matters that need to be agreed and reflected in the schedule for stage 2 implementation under the Federation Funding Agreement - Environment that is expected to be established by the end of 2021. December 2018. Stage 1 will provide funding to NSW, Victoria and South Australia to undertake pre-construction activities on supply and constraints projects. The NSW Schedule was signed on 28 February 2019, the Victorian Schedule on 22 March 2019 and the SA shown above. The final profile is yet to be determined and required adjustments to the funding profiles to match project delivery will be considered at each Budget opportunity. The Stage 1 Project Agreement was executed at the Ministerial Council meeting on 14 package of supply and constraints projects in the southern Basin, as part of the Sustainable Diversion Limit Adjustment Mechanism under the Murray-Darling Basin Plan. For this request, the current notional profile for the combined supply/constraints measures profile is 1.
