

## Senate Education and Employment Legislation Committee Budget Estimates 2021-22 Thursday, 3 June 2021 Daily summary

Here is the summary of today's proceedings in the Education and Employment Legislation Committee estimates hearing.

The committee met from 9.00am to 11.00pm.

The committee called the Department of Education, Skills and Employment.

Topics discussed by the committee included:

- Government's childcare policy announced on 2 May;
- workforce strategies for early childhood and childcare;
- childcare out-of-pocket costs, overall costs and childcare subsidies;
- resources used by the Respect Matters program to support respectful relationships;
- development of a National Youth Policy Framework by the Youth Taskforce;
- expected repayment of student debt from the Higher Education Loan Program;
- University undergraduate enrolments;
- funding for the National Skills Agreement;
- Commonwealth Scholarship Program funding allocation for South Australia;
- funding and uptake of various incentives provided by the government to encourage apprentices and trainees, particularly the Supporting Apprentices and Trainees (SAT) and Boosting Apprenticeship Commencements (BAC) measures;
- mutual obligations for job seekers receiving income support and the Employer Reporting line;
- new Employment Services model; and
- appointment of the new Minister for Employment, Workforce, Skills, Small and Family Business, Minister Stuart Robert;
