

## Senate Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport Legislation Committee Budget Estimates 2022-23 Monday, 4 April 2022 Daily summary

Here is the summary of today's proceedings in the Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport Legislation Committee estimates hearing.

The committee met from 9.01am until 5.47pm.

## The committee called:

- department's response to road safety reports by the Joint Select Committee on Road Safety and the Senate Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport References Committee;
- update on the Singleton Bypass project;
- funding for Roads of Strategic Importance;
- updates on coastal shipping reform;
- impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on shipping exports;
- responsibility for security upgrades and regional airports;
- funds committed to the student boarding facility under the Barkley Regional Deal;
- Regional Accelerator Program;
- mooring systems at Christmas Island;
- abolition of the advisory body to the National Water Grid Authority;
- update on the construction timeframe of Inland Rail;
- update on appointing a permanent CEO to the Inland Rail Corp;
- regulations preventing Blackhawk military helicopters being used in some capacities in firefighting;
- costs of risk category upgrades at different airports;
- regulations relating to medical testing for pilots;
- air operator certificates;

- initial CASA responses to the General Aviation report recommendations;
- CASA staffing levels and risk management; and
- re-drawing of flight paths at Brisbane Airport.
