

# Senate Legal and Constitutional Affairs Legislation Committee Supplementary Budget Estimates 2025–26 Tuesday, 2 December 2025 Daily summary

The committee met from 9.00am until 9.01pm.

The committee called the Home Affairs Portfolio and discussed the following topics:

# National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA)

- Staff culture and NEMA's work to improve culture; and
- Claims of Corruption within NEMA and referrals made to the National Anti-Corruption Commission.

# **Cross portfolio and General Matters**

- Unanswered questions on notice;
- Machinery of Government agency changes to the Attorney-General's portfolio to Home Affairs portfolio and associated transition costs;
- Progress of FOI request made to Home Affairs and the National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC); and
- Unmet targets in annual report.

#### Special Envoy to Combat Anti-Semitism

- Meetings with the Prime Minister relating to the blueprint to combat antisemitism; and
- Rally outside NSW Parliament and Commissioner's response.

#### Special Envoy to Combat Islamophobia

- Removing references to 'religious cause' or 'religious motivation' from the definition of terrorist attack in the Criminal Code;
- · Meetings with the Prime Minister; and
- Staffing, annual budget.

#### Outcome 1

- Cybersecurity for automated vehicles;
- Airport security concerns; and
- Listing of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps as a terrorist organisation.

# Outcome 2

- Details of Australian Government's offshore detention arrangements with Nauru;
- Migration levels and housing policy; and
- Statistics on visa holders.

# Outcome 3

- Illicit tobacco and e-cigarette trade;
- Memorandum of understanding with Nauru government and details of agreement; and
- Alleged leaks of NZYQ cohort members' personal details by Department of Home Affairs.

### <u>Australian Transaction Reports and Analysis Centre (AUSTRAC)</u>

• Activist groups receiving foreign funding and the response of AUSTRAC.

# Australian Federal Police (AFP)

- AFP collaboration with Pacific Island Nations; and
- AFP conduct matters referred to the National Anti-Corruption Commission.

# <u>Australian Security Intelligence Organisation (ASIO)</u>

- Women and children detained in Syrian camps; and
- Four corners program on 'Agent Marcus'.
