

Senate Community Affairs Legislation Committee Supplementary Budget Estimates 2025–26 Wednesday, 4 December 2025 Daily summary

The committee met from 9.16am until 10.49pm.

The committee called the Health, Disability and Ageing portfolio, discussing the following topics:

Department of Health, Disability and Ageing (DoHDA) – Whole of Portfolio/Corporate Matters

- Status of outstanding questions on notice and information around various government contracts; and
- Viability of the aged care system with specific reference to long-term hospitalisations due to aged care rationing.

DoHDA – Outcome 3: Ageing and Aged Care

- Latest figures surrounding various aged care packages, its composition and associated costings;
- Average wait time for assessments, including appointments for an assessment;
- The 'No Worse Off' principle and limitations currently in place on increases to provider fees;
- Variable approach to assets and income test to determine eligibility of aged care services;
- Negotiations between the Commonwealth and the states and territories in relation to the National Health Reform Agreement;
- Independent auditor's report and annual performance outcomes concerning equitable aged care services;
- Current figures and future projections on number of available residential aged care beds;
- Current figures on individuals subject to the 'grandfathering' arrangement;
- The Australian National Aged Care Classification funding model;
- Turnover in Aged Care facilities per yearly basis;
- Use of AI to inform algorithms and validate tools in assessing aged care records;
- Approvals made to ensure First Nations elders receive timely assessments and access to services; and
- Cost impacts of absorbing the Commonwealth Home Support Program into Support at Home program.

- Reviews into dental healthcare and prosthetics for individuals suffering from cancer;
- The establishment of the National Oral Health Plan;
- Update on breast screening funding options;
- Therapeutic Goods Administration response to the United States Food and Drug Administration's restrictions to Wild Child laboratories, including sunscreen products;
- Commonwealth Supported Places to medical schools;
- Tobacco excise effect on public health;
- Adequacy of Commonwealth funding to hospitals;
- National Mental Health Commission Suicide and Evaluation Framework;
- Pelvic mesh and associated complications;
- Status of the government's response to the second Senate Tick Bourne Diseases inquiry;
- Correlation between the childhood vaccination schedule and autism, including updates to the US' vaccines and autism page;
- Recent reporting from the Northern Territory government and NT Health on health and care constraints;
- Oversight from government and associated governance structures to assist the delivery of services to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples;
- First Nations aged care issues;
- Vaccine testing and use of puberty blocker drugs;
- Interim Australian Centre for Disease Control and its establishment;
- Preservatives in single use injections;
- Adverse events attributed to COVID-19 and other vaccines;
- Records on self-harm within First Nations communities; and
- Proliferation of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders within the Kimberly region.
