Name of bill: Ensuring Northern Territory Rights Bill 2021

Reasons for referral/principal issues for consideration:

- 1. How this bill will align Commonwealth involvement with laws of the Northern Territory similar to the Commonwealth's involvement with laws of Australian states.
- 2. The benefits that will be delivered to Northern Territorians through having legal rights that are equivalent to residents of Australian states.
- 3. Outcomes that may be achieved through the removal of: (a) Limitations applying to the Northern Territory Legislative Assembly pertaining to the acquisition of property on just terms, (b) Laws that limit the ability of the Northern Legislative Assembly to legislate for voluntary assisted dying if the Legislative Assembly chooses to do so, and (c) Limitations on the ability of the Northern Territory Legislative Assembly to make laws conferring powers in relation to the hearing and determination of employment disputes.
- 4. Referring this bill will allow broad consultation with a range of stakeholders to ensure all have opportunity to provide input so as to gain the greatest understanding of issues that this bill seeks to address, and how the bill, if passed, will do so.
