Amy Mullins is a broadcaster, board member, gender equality advocate, and public speaker. She is a Member of the Ministerial Council on Women's Equality (State Government of Victoria). Amy is also the presenter of *Uncommon Sense*, a weekly three-hour radio program on politics and current events, international affairs, history, art, and the natural world, on Melbourne's 3RRR FM.

Previously, Amy was Executive Director of the Women's Leadership Institute Australia (WLIA). She was with the institute for over four and a half years. As an Advisory Committee Member, Amy helped guide and shape the Pathways to Politics Program for Women at the Melbourne School of Government.

Amy is passionate about seeing more women enter politics from across the political spectrum.
