I wanted to update you about the posts on the Fight for the Reef website and their facebook page.

As you are probably aware on Thursday 12th November the Queensland government banned the sea dumping of capital dredge spoil in the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area.

Fight for the reef were very quick to post about their 'victory'. Please see attachment labelled ffr fb post 121115.

Today, 16/11/15 they have released a media statement which is posted onto their website <https://fightforthereef.org.au/landmark-victory-for-the-reef-and-people-power-as-dredge-spoil-dump-ban-passed-in-qld-parliament/>

Yet, they have still not managed to change the wording on their donation page.

The donations from this group are paid to Australian Marine Conservation Society (AMCS). I personally believe that they are gaining funds through deception.

This is the statement on their donation page **"And yet the Government has allowed the dumping of 3 million cubic metres of dredged seabed from Abbot Point in the Reef's marine park."**

The current proposal for capital dredging at Abbot Point is still under consideration by Mr Hunt's office. The amount has been reduced to 1.1 million cubic metres. The disposal site is onshore at a site known as T2 which is industrial land at the port.

They are misleading the public to gain donations for a 'legal fighting fund' and yet a decision has not even been made.
