The overwhelming majority of the Australian population, including 3 out of 4 Catholics and 4 out of 5 Anglicans believe that voluntary euthanasia should be legal in restricted circumstances.

Who are we?

We are an Australian ecumenical group, with Catholic, Anglican, Uniting, Lutheran, Baptist, Unitarian, Jehovah's Witness, Church of Christ and others already represented. All are welcome.

We believe that, as a demonstration of love and compassion, those with a terminal or hopeless illness should have the option of a pain-free, peaceful and dignified death with legal voluntary euthanasia.

Our group is independent of other aid-in-dying organisations. However, we work in cooperation with many of these societies towards our common goals.

The group was co-founded by Rev. Trevor Bensch of Adelaide and Ian Wood, now of Mittagong. Their work is endorsed by respected theologian, Rev. Dr Craig de Vos.

Our aims

A key aim of our organisation is to make it known to all Australians as well as all politicians that many Christians support legalisation of choice for voluntary euthanasia, holding it to be consistent with Jesus' message of love and compassion.

Our principal activity is to lobby Members of Parliament through letter writing and public campaigns. It is intended that our statements are moderate, respectful and based on facts.

We also aim to counter misinformation put forward by our opponents and to educate the public on why medically assisted dying should be a legal right of people who are hopelessly ill.

The main opposition to law reform arises from some fundamentalist Christians and conservative groups, such as the Australian Christian Lobby. We are seeking to counteract their disturbing dogmatic approach to this issue.
