Airline Overview

- In our 34th year of operations, our diverse range of aviation activities include scheduled airline operations to King and Flinders Island from Launceston and Essendon, FIFO / charter operations and freight services throughout QLD on behalf of Team Global Express (TGE).
- Headquartered in Melbourne, Victoria, Sharp Airlines employs more than 100 staff across Australia with bases in Launceston, Melbourne (Essendon), Adelaide and Brisbane.
- We employ approx. 30 staff in our Launceston base in reservations, engineering and ground handling roles.
- We currently operate a fleet of 18 Metroliner aircraft and have a proud history of supporting the island communities that we serve.

Freight Operations

- The Metroliner aircraft carries up to 19 passengers.
- The seating capacity can be reconfigured to maximise freight capacity on passenger flights, allowing the aircraft to carry up to 1,000 kg of freight (depending on passenger numbers).



Freight Operations

- FY24 Statistics – Sharp Tasmanian Freight Operations *excluding TGE operations
- LST / BWT to KNS – 145,650 kg
- LST to FLS – 90,338 kg
- MEB to KNS – 212,259 kg
- MEB to FLS – 4,900 kg
- **Total – 453,147 kg**
- Most freight is carried too the islands, with only a minor percentage of export freight carried.

Freight Operations

- Freight categories and customers
- Supermarkets - Fruit and vege / perishable goods / general groceries / milk, dairy and frozen
- Hospital and medical supplies, pathology
- Café, restaurants and pub supplies
- Businesses – Auto Repairs and components, Seafood and Meat Exports, Tourism
- Govt. Departments, Local Council, Police and Emergency Services.

Passenger Operations

- FY24 Statistics – Tasmanian Passenger Operations
- LST / BWT to KNS – 15,164
- LST to FLS – 14,916
- MEB to KNS – 8,410
- MEB to FLS – 6,195
- **Total – 44,685 passengers**
- NB: State Government schemes such as PTAS and Bass Strait Island air travel subsidy.



Summary

- Airlines operations are capital intensive and require large investment and infrastructure, staff and equipment.
- Return on investment is low and margins are slim to provide a cost-effective solution and remain competitive. Capacity and frequency low compared to major domestic airlines.
- Council landing / passenger fees are incorporated into our operating costs.
- An expansion of the TFES as per the Council's presentation would make freight transport (and passenger travel) more affordable for local residents and businesses, stimulating activity for air transport operators.
