Barbara Shaw, a strong opponent of this way of dealing with Aboriginal people, has called on the Australian Human Rights Commission to request that the government withdraw its proposed legislation and instead work in genuine partnership with Aboriginal people in the NT. Is this such a hard thing to ask of you?
