**Re: Senate Inquiry into MIS**

Whilst this is not a 'submission' in the strict sense of the term, it is a response to the lead question in the advertisement re the Senate Inquiry [Tas Country, Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August 2014], namely, ***'have you been affected by the recent collapse of Managed Investment Schemes in Tasmania?'***

The 'affect' on me has been by association.

The 15 acres of land that I live on [Volume 23624; Folio 1] is surrounded by plantation developed via an MIS. The 'affects' of MIS collapse on me are:

1. Difficulty in identifying the current owner of the property;
