The most important services for the NDIS to provide are:

Recreation and community access, Support for families and carers, Flexible inhome/outside home respite

I support the introduction of the NDIS.

- that our family will be able to access services that are flexible
- system is holistic ensuring carers are supported as well.
- individulised
- more respite support
- hoping it will cater for people with moderate intellectual disability to be supported in all areas emotionally, environmentally, physically and socially. Hoping that the funding will be enough and that there will be options in disability and mainstream services.
- I would love our son to be supported in a mainstream workplace he has been in a mainstream school system.
