



Reviewing the role of the Administrator of the Indian Ocean Territories

Based on Christmas Island for a term of three years, the Administrator of the Indian Ocean Territories is the appointed representative of the Australian government in the Indian Ocean Territories. The Administrator is responsible for building and maintaining positive and constructive relations between the Australian Government and the communities on Christmas Island and the Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

The IOT Administrator explains the rationale for government policies and initiatives and provides advice to inform the government's analysis and decisions on programs and initiatives.

Current Administrator, Mr Barry Haase and two of his predecessors will appear before the Committee to share their experiences and ideas for enhancing the effectiveness of the position.

Committee Chair, Mr Luke Simpkins MP, said territories residents have mixed views on the future of the Administrator role.

"Some submitters to the inquiry into governance in the Indian Ocean Territories have advocated for the Administrator to have a stronger role and powers, others to enhance local government responsibilities.

"We'll be testing these ideas with those who have firsthand experience of the role," he said.
