#### **Question:**

2. The form to ask for a review of determination (NRS073-120424) states:

- 'I acknowledge that after the review is completed, the following may happen:
- the redress outcome may stay the same,
- if an offer was made it may increase or decrease, or
- a different decision may be made about whether I am eligible for redress.'
- a. Is this representation accurate?
- b. What is the basis for including this language in the form?

#### Answer:

This representation is correct. A review determination can have the effect of reducing the amount of the redress payment determined in the original determination, if the reviewer is satisfied that:

- (a) either:
  - (i) the reduction is the result of new information from the applicant or an institution; or
  - (ii) the Operator has reasonable grounds to believe that information given, a document produced, or a statement made to an officer of the scheme in relation to the application for redress, or the application for review, is false or misleading in a material particular; and
- (b) the reduction is appropriate, having regard to the principles set out in section 10.

While the Scheme considers that these circumstances are unlikely to eventuate in the vast majority of reviews, the basis for including this language in the form is to provide transparency to applicants regarding all potential review outcomes. This is consistent with the Scheme's limited 'no worse off' provisions built into the review process.

If no new information is provided, a redress offer cannot be reduced where the reviewing Independent Decision Maker (IDM) has the same information and documents that were available to the original IDM.

### Answer:

3. a. The Scheme's website content on Independent Decision Makers (IDMs) is currently under review. New content is being developed on the role of the IDMs.

b. The Scheme is reviewing its position on the publication of Independent Decision Maker biographies, as it undertakes an assessment of the personal security risks in continuing to publish this information.

c. At this time, the names and biographies of IDMs are not available on the National Redress Scheme website.
