

European Union Directive 2000/56/EC

The European Union, through its Directive 2000/56/EC, required all member countries by 1 October 2003 to ensure applicants for learner driver licences had basic first aid knowledge.¹ To date over half of European countries (56%) require first aid or basic life support training be completed as a condition for obtaining a driver license, and many European countries also require that drivers carry a first aid kit.^{2,4} Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Estonia, Germany, Hungary Latvia, Lithuania, Denmark, Slovakia, Belgium and Switzerland require the possession of a first aid certificate before a driver's licence is granted.^{3,4} In Norway, 95% of the population is trained in first aid as a result of the driver licensing system. In Germany and Austria over 80% of the population is trained, and in Iceland 75%.^{5,4}

Additionally, United Nations resolution adopted by the General Assembly on 10 April 2014, Improving Global Road Safety (A/Res/68/269) encourages Member States to implement comprehensive policies on post-crash care (and to consider enacting legislation to legally protect bystanders who in good faith provide care to those injured in a crash).⁶
