We were affected by fires in the valley from September 2019 until January 2020 only just free of smoke in the last few days.

Please consider to following submission;

Firstly we need to stop COAL MINING to reduce carbon in the environment.

Future RFS volunteers to under go medical and fitness tests. Our local RFS has 5 women and I think 3 men the average age must be 60 plus.

Hefty fines for those who carelessly or purposely start fires during Fire Bands. Repeat

offenders to receive a term in prison.
