Re: senate enquiry into the No Jab No Pay legislation.

I would firstly like to say that I am not Anti vaccination. I in fact I am pro vaccination but more so, Pro-choice.

When I had my first baby, We went along to get his shots at 8 weeks old. Within a very short period of time he became very unwell, high temperatures, and bouts of lethargy mixed with relentless high pitched screaming and fitting.
