Inquiry into Patent Amendment (Human Genes and Biological Materials) Bill 2010

BCAG NSW support the issues addressed in this Amendment. They reflect and address those raised by us in our submission to and appearance before the Senate Inquiry in 2009. We believe that this Amendment clearly comes under the imperative of being in the public interest. Our members, people affected by breast cancer, are extremely concerned abbot the threats regarding access to and ownership of breast cancer genes, which are posed by the enforcement of international and Australian gene patents.

This Amendment will assist in clarifying the fact that patents should never have been, or should be, allowed over naturally occurring human genes and biological materials. As an ethical and philosophical principle, we do not believe that genes as natural parts of the human body should be patentable. We strongly recommend that Australian patent law be amended so that no part of a living thing can be patented.

Ownership of genes High risk families and access to affordable genetic testing Access to medical and genetic research.
