Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment (Retaining Federal Approval Powers) Bill 2012

Pacific Hydro would like to echo the sentiment expressed in the submission from Sustainable Business Australia in relation to the above-named amendment bill.

We agree with SBA that national environmental issues need strong national leadership and direction. The primary, and crucial, role of the EPBC Act is to protect nationally and internationally important environment, biodiversity and heritage.

In Pacific Hydro's experience, the current EPBC referral process works well, concentrating on EPBC species/habitats on the basis of scientific merit. Were the process to change, Pacific Hydro is concerned that the intention of the amendment – to 'streamline the process' – would not be delivered, and may in fact lead to further 'green tape', increased bureaucracy in each state and a devolution of the consistent approach taken at the Federal level.
