Question on Notice No. 1 - Japanese submarine

Senator Dastyari asked on 30 September 2014, Hansard page 37:

CHAIR: Mr King, you have been on one of these submarines?

Mr King: I have been on one.

CHAIR: On the recent trip?

Mr King: No, not the recent trip; previous trips.

Senator CONROY: When were they? You are like hen's teeth. You are the second person I have met in the course of the evening who has actually been on a Japanese submarine, but you are the first who has been on a Soryu or involved with a Soryu.

Mr King: To be clear, I have been on two.

Senator EDWARDS: The first one was 28 years ago.

Mr King: I did on work miniature subs, but that is different. February was one date and I am not sure of the other. It might have been May.

Senator CONROY: February and May this year?

Mr King: Yes.

CHAIR: Could someone from your team get that to the committee on notice?

Mr King: Yes. I am sure I have not got any team listening, but we can get that to you on notice.

Response:

Mr Warren King, Chief Executive Officer of the Defence Materiel Organisation, toured a Soryu class submarine during a visit to Japan over the period 18-20 February 2014 and on a second occasion during a visit over the period 20-22 May 2014.
