"debt-driven consumption"

Every dollar of the remaining stimulus package should be spent on a strategy "Away from oil" after
peak oil (2005-2008) triggered (not entirely caused) the financial crisis.

For example, Councils are spending stimulus money on cosmetic projects, not on how to prepare for
declining oil production e.g. by converting their truck fleet to CNG (compressed natural gas)
