Please consider this email a formal submission by me to the Senate Standing Committee on Community Affairs Inquiry into the National Disability Insurance Scheme Bill 2012.

The current disability system has many problems that need to be addressed.

I don't have a child with a disability but know a number of friends who do. I cannot believe the pressure and burden that is placed on families that have to care for their loved ones with insufficient financial or structural support services. Also for those with disabilities there is not enough training and education for them in order to make a contribution to the economy and provide self esteem in that endeavor.

I support the introduction of the NDIS.
