



JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON THE NATIONAL DISABILITY INSURANCE SCHEME

TABLING OF REPORT FOR GENERAL ISSUES INQUIRY

31 March 2022

The Joint Standing Committee on the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) today tabled its final report for the 46th Parliament for its General Issues inquiry, which provides an overview of the committee's work since the commencement of this Parliament on 2 July 2019.

In the 46th Parliament, the committee completed 7 inquiries, under which it has:

- received 908 public submissions,
- held 32 public hearings,
- made 177 recommendations; and
- tabled 12 unanimous reports.

The committee acknowledges actions that have already been taken by the National Disability Insurance Agency and the Australian Government to address many of the recommendations made by this committee over the life of this Parliament.

The committee is confident that a re-established committee in the 47th Parliament will closely monitor any ongoing work which addresses recommendations made by this committee and will remain interested in any forthcoming government responses, and also continue to investigate the issues raised in the committee's recent inquiries which require further consideration.

“On behalf of the committee, I would like to thank all those who contributed to its inquiries by lodging submissions, providing additional information or expressing their views via correspondence,” Committee Chair, The Hon Kevin Andrews MP said today.

“The committee also thanks those who gave their time to attend the committee's public hearings. In particular, the committee thanks NDIS participants who shared their experiences.”
