Review of the Intelligence Services Legislation Amendment Bill 2023

Thank you for your invitation to make a submission to the above-mentioned review, received 27 July 2023. As you are aware, AUSTRAC is Australia's anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism financing (AML/CTF) regulator and financial intelligence unit (FIU).

AUSTRAC's dual function

As a regulator, AUSTRAC oversees the compliance of more than 17,000 Australian businesses with the Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Terrorism Financing Act 2006 (the AML/CTF Act) and associated Rules. AUSTRAC's regulated population includes a broad range of businesses. These businesses must comply with obligations in the AML/CTF Act, and implement effective AML/CTF systems and controls to identify and mitigate money laundering and terrorism financing (ML/TF) risk.

As Australia's FIU, AUSTRAC is the custodian of the financial data received from reporting entities and provides financial transaction data and actionable financial intelligence to a broad range of partner agencies (including law enforcement, national security and regulatory agencies), as well as international counterparts. Partner agencies use this information to assist them to detect, prevent and disrupt ML/TF and other serious crime.

Oversight of AUSTRAC's intelligence function

Financial intelligence is a critical piece of the national security architecture, preserving the integrity of Australia's financial system. It has become increasingly vital in securing law enforcement outcomes in the face of new and emerging threats.
