Korea-Australia Free Trade Agreement under review

The Joint Standing Committee on Treaties will conduct public hearings in Sydney and Brisbane this week to examine the costs and benefits of the proposed Korea-Australia Free Trade Agreement (KAFTA).

Korea is Australia's third-largest export market, fourth-largest trading partner, and a growing investment partner. It is Australia's fifth-largest market for agricultural exports and an important export market for Australian ores and concentrates, crude petroleum, coal, inorganic chemical elements, pharmaceuticals, and automotive parts.

KAFTA has been generally welcomed by business and industry but submissions to the Committee's inquiry have raised a number of concerns including the inclusion of investor-state dispute mechanisms and changes to intellectual property rights.

Committee Chair Wyatt Roy said that the Committee is interested in speaking to a range of witnesses including academic experts, industry and business representatives, community organisations and the unions so as to assess the impact of KAFTA on the broader economy and community.
