



PARLIAMENTARY JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON THE NATIONAL DISABILITY INSURANCE SCHEME

NDIS PLANNING FINAL REPORT TABLED 1 December 2020

The Parliamentary Joint Committee on the National Disability Insurance Scheme today tabled its final report on NDIS Planning.

The unanimous report examines key issues that participants and their families, advocates and providers have raised about NDIS planning processes.

“Since the committee tabled its interim report in December 2019, which contained 14 recommendations, the Australian Government has introduced broad reforms that reflect the committee’s previous recommendations, including the introduction of fully costed, detailed draft plans,” Committee Chair, the Hon Kevin Andrews said.

“However, further reforms are needed to ensure that the planning process is fair, transparent and consistent for all participants, no matter their circumstances.”

This final report makes 42 recommendations intended to bring greater transparency, consistency and accountability to how the NDIS is administered and implemented.

The committee thanks all those who contributed to the inquiry, particularly participants, their family members and advocates.
