For example, which organisations have been directly contacted and invited to make a written submission or otherwise share their views? Which organisations has the Commission met with in person?

#### **Answer:**

All of the organisations referred to have been engaged directly, either through their direct participation in online meetings, roundtables, bilateral meetings, via email, or through written submissions, proposals or queries.

Through its ongoing contact with various stakeholders, the Commission has invited and received views, ideas and proposals in writing and verbally to inform the Commission's advice to Government.
