Pacific Island Free Trade

A new free trade agreement between Australia, New Zealand and Pacific Island nations will be examined at a public hearing on Monday by the federal parliament's <u>Joint Standing Committee on</u> <u>Treaties</u>.

The Australian Government expects the PACER Plus free trade agreement to encourage economic growth and social stability in the Pacific region by freeing up trade and investment opportunities.

The Agreement is tailored to the particular barriers to economic growth experienced by Pacific Island countries, including small population size and isolation.

Committee Chair, <u>Mr Stuart Robert MP</u>, said Pacific Island countries are amongst the world's most vulnerable economies.

"PACER Plus will afford Pacific Island countries the protection they need as they develop, while allowing them to benefit from the advantages of free trade," Mr Robert said.

The Committee will also examine a treaty allowing spent fuel from Australia's research nuclear reactor to be shipped to France for reprocessing.
