- a. Was this statement made based on advice provided by the Department? If so, on what date was that advice provided?
- b. Does the Minister stand by this estimate of the aggregate value of JobKeeper payments and the Coronavirus supplement to the creative workforce based on the latest available information?
- c. Has the Minister received any feedback from stakeholders that this figure may be inaccurate? If so, what steps did the Minister take to respond to this feedback?
