Repair and upgrade work to be carried out at HMAS Stirling, Western Australia

The Public Works Committee is conducting a public hearing into proposed redevelopment works at HMAS *Stirling* in Western Australia.

Accommodating a working population of approximately 3600, HMAS *Stirling* provides support to Australian, and occasionally allied, naval vessels. This includes command, administration, training, live-in-accommodation, ship replenishment, repair, maintenance and logistics.

In order to continue providing operational support, several areas with ageing infrastructure require upgrade, repair or replacement. This includes the existing road network, combined potable and fire-fighting water supplies, electrical power supply and distribution system, base sewerage and waste water systems and current data and communications infrastructure.

Where possible, the Department of Defence proposes to repair or upgrade existing facilities, replacing facilities only where needed.
