## Issues paper and call for submissions

19 May 2021

The Senate Select Committee on Australia as a Technology and Financial Centre (formerly the Senate Select Committee on Financial Technology and Regulatory Technology) has released an issues paper to guide the final phase of its inquiry.

The committee's second report was tabled in April 2021, making 23 recommendations to government. The committee will now take further evidence before delivering a final report with additional recommendations in October 2021.

The committee has today published an issues paper outlining the committee's intended direction for this final phase of the inquiry and some specific areas of interest, with the aim of accelerating Australia's development as a technology and financial centre.
