Senate Committee inquiry into the provisions of the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) Amendment Bill 2014

Deakin University supports the measures in the TEQSA Amendment Bill 2014 to increase the efficiency of TEQSA and reduce the regulatory burden on higher education institutions. In particular, in keeping with the position of Universities Australia, we endorse the removal of TEQSA's quality assessment function to enable it to focus on its core activities of provider registration and course accreditation.
