CHAIR: What's the definition—I've heard the term 'orphan designation' over the last two days, but we haven't had it defined for us.

Response:

An orphan drug is a medicine, vaccine or in vivo diagnostic agent that meets the requirements of regulation 16J of the Therapeutic Goods Regulations 1990. The orphan drug prevalence threshold referred to within the session being that "the condition affects fewer than 5 in 10,000 individuals in Australia when the application is made".
