Enquiry into the Australian manufacturing industry

My submission concerning this extremely important matter follows.

For far too long, reliance on cheap overseas imports has decimated Australian industry. Urgent action is needed now to rebuild and diversify Australian industry and infrastructure, reduce reliance on foreign investment and imports.

Very substantial investment is needed for strategic manufacturing and infrastructure. This could be led by the Australian government and include a development bank, commercial banks, and equity finance.

- Australian owned transport and agricultural equipment, vehicle industry, rail and rolling stock, agricultural machinery,
- machine tools
- metals processing industries
- essential consumer goods manufacturing
- telecommunications and transport
- agriculture and food processing industries
- low-cost energy which is needed for development of new industries.
