My husband and I (Neville and Deborah Sketchley) have lived in the now infamous “RED ZONE” at Salt Ash for the past 44 years.

We came here to try to be somewhat self-sufficient and to create a place of tranquillity and enjoyment.

Since September 2015 our world has been turned upside down and our physical and mental health has been suffering due to the overwhelming realisation of our land and water being contaminated by toxic substances leaching from Williamtown RAAF Base.

Why has the RAAF Williamtown taken so long to let the community know about this?

Why has it taken years for our local council to inform the community?

Our land cannot be remediated. Our house and land have forever been marked as TOXIC. Our vegetables, eggs and fruit from our trees are inedible.

The health of our daughter and grandson and our health may have been damaged due to this Toxic Substance which is bio-accumulative and a persistent organic pollutant and has probably been leaching out for years.
