A comparative analysis of all of the stories that over the last six months have been published online by Nine's newspaper publishers, as against all of the stories that over the last six months have been published in Nine's newspapers, to identify any story that was published online but not in the newspapers, cannot be completed before the Committee's deadline of 18 October 2024.

However, Nine can clarify that all material published in print or digital form by Nine's newspaper publishers listed below, and Nine's website <u>nine.com.au</u>, are regulated by the Australian Press Council. These publications must comply with its principles including (but not limited to) accuracy, clarity, fairness, balance, integrity, transparency and privacy, as well as specific standards and advisory guidelines. These publishers are under an obligation to cooperate with the Council, are subject to its complaint procedure, and must publish any adjudication by the Council:
