

## ACCC Fresh Quality Guidelines Identification and Entry

**High Quality Produce** has little to no discolouration and is firm to touch. There is no unpleasant odour or soft to touch spots. It is rich in colour and crispness.

**Low Quality Produce** has strong discolouration and soft to touch spots. It can have an unpleasant odour and can also “leak” liquid. Its colour can be faded.

### Meat, Poultry and Seafood

#### **Identifying and Recording Meat, Poultry and Seafood**

Meat Products are identified by Premium and Regular. Please enter price identifying the cheapest and most expensive price for a product and enter price accordingly.



I.E MINCE BEEF PREMIUM PER KG, MINCE BEEF REGULAR PER KG

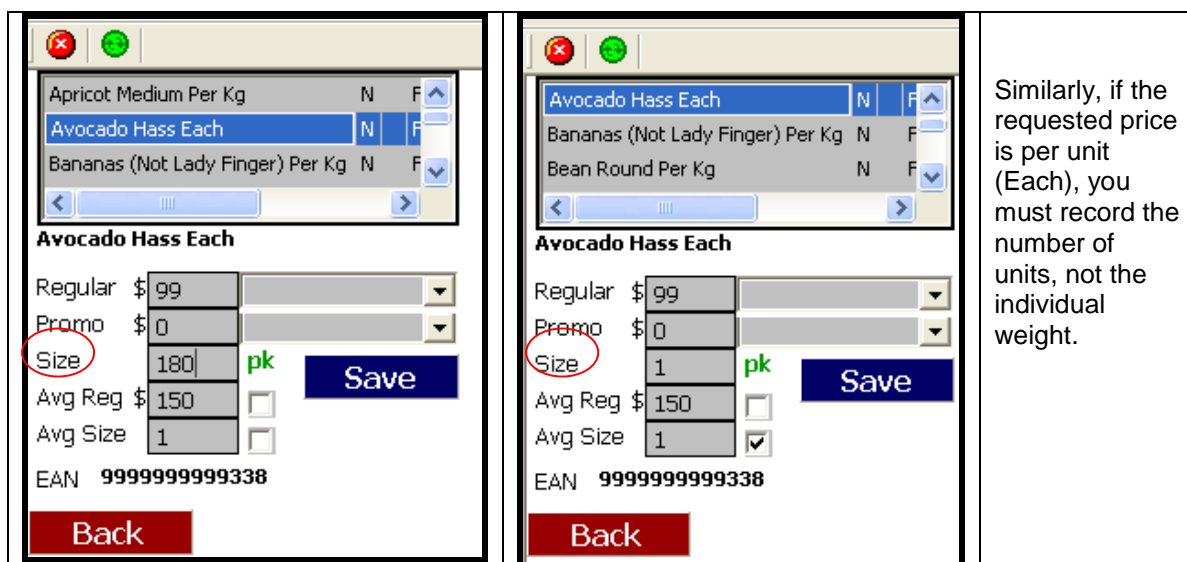
Any products that are not listed as regular and premium please use the methodology above.

### Fresh Fruit & Vegetable

#### **Recording Fresh Produce Prices**

As Fresh produce (Fruit/Vegetables & Meat) can be very varied in size, it is important that you record the correct size for the product you have collected. If the price you have recorded is not for the requested size you must enter the correct details into the ‘Size’ text box. Please take care to note whether the price requested is a Per Kilo or ‘Each’ price.

	 <div style="margin-top: 10px; padding-left: 10px;"> <p>In the example above, the requested price is per Kilo of Zucchini. Therefore you must record the weight of the Zucchini that you record. If a Zucchini costs \$2.19 per unit, weigh the item and record the weight.</p> </div>



## Packaging Terminology

### **Bulk**

Buying product in mass, quantity, or volume.

An example of this would include – 10kg of potatoes / 3kg of Oranges

### **Pre-packed**

Items that are packaged in plastic, string, paper etc.

An example of this would include – 10kg of potatoes / 3kg of Oranges

### **Punnet**

Most common with Berries, a punnet is a predetermined weight of items pre-packed

An example of this would include – Strawberries 250gm Punnet.

### **Per kilo**

The price of an item weighing 1000 grams

An example of this would include – Broccoli \$2.99 per kg. The price is \$2.99

### **Each**

A single item or unit

An example of this would include – Kiwifruit 50c each. The price is 50c

### **Organic**

Food raised without chemicals and processed without additives. It is often stated on the item or signage that the product is “Organic”. It is usually higher in price than Non organic products

An example of this would include – Organic Corn – Pre-packed \$8.99

### **Loose**

A term used to describe non pre-packaged products

An example of this would include carrots – Loose Carrots – \$1.29 per kilo

### **Australian Grown**

Produce is grown and transported in Australia. In the case of non Australian grown items, they must legally be labelled with Country of Origin.

An example of non Australian Grown produce would include – Lycees – Product of China.
