Private sector's role in international development

The federal parliamentary inquiry into the role of the private sector in promoting economic development and reducing poverty in the Indo-Pacific region will be further explored at public hearings in Canberra.

The Foreign Affairs and Aid Sub-Committee of the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade will hold the series of hearings over this sitting fortnight.

Government, academic, private and NGO sectors are invited to discuss opportunities to leverage Australia's foreign aid contribution, public-private partnerships, transparency, accountability and supporting women in building economies in sectors including agriculture and extraction, education, banking, infrastructure development and manufacturing.
