COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT FOR THE CAMPBELL BARRACKS REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT, SWANBOURNE

1. This letter is to inform the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works (PWC) of the nature and extent of community consultation undertaken as part of the Campbell Barracks Redevelopment Project (the Project).

2. Broadly, the strategy for community consultation adopted by Defence was undertaken with the objective of ensuring:

- that the public was informed about the project using cost effective, wide ranging communication channels;
- b. an opportunity for stakeholders and the public to raise any concerns;
- an opportunity for stakeholders and the public to discuss issues that directly affect them; and
- d. the public had every opportunity to raise issues of concern or seek further information.
- 3. The consultation activities undertaken included:
- Detailed email correspondence with State and Federal members, with individual briefings conducted where requested. The members consulted, with a short description of the outcomes of the contact are detailed in Annex A. An example of the correspondence sent to the respective groups is detailed in Annex B;
- b. Advertisements in the local newspapers, listed at Annex C; and
- c. A Public Consultation Session undertaken, details listed at Annex D;

4. Key issues raised by the Community through the Consultation sessions are listed at Annex E.

5. Feedback regarding the Project was extremely positive with strong support from the local community. Of particular note was the Project's potential to generate employment for small, medium and large sized local businesses.

6. Defence is satisfied that all reasonable steps to inform stakeholders and the public about the Campbell Barracks Redevelopment project were taken. No significant issues that are likely to impact the proposed works were identified during the consultation process. A more detailed briefing on methodology, the Campbell Barracks Redevelopment Communications Strategy and outcomes can be provided to the Committee upon request.
